Recovery Community Centers (RCCs) are community-based, peer-run organizations that offer resources and compassionate support for individuals with substance use disorders and their families, no matter what phase of use or recovery they may be in. RCCs are not treatment centers but they can connect people to treatment or other community resources, depending on their needs.

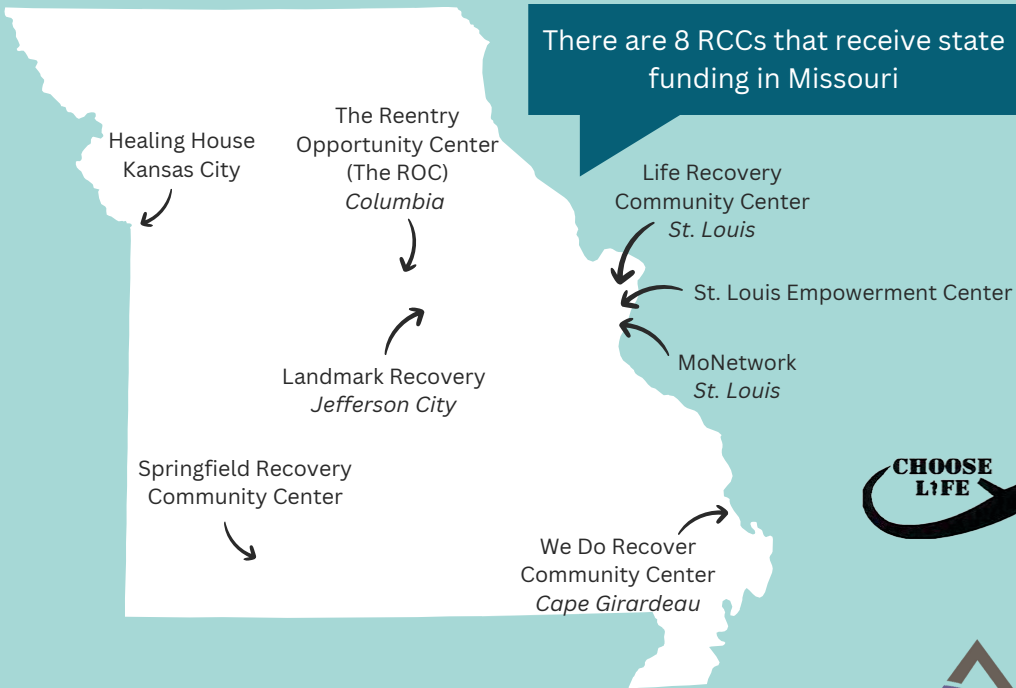
Each RCC offers a variety of unique services, including:

- recovery coaching and peer support
- employment assistance
- referrals and resources
- naloxone
- support groups and fellowship

and so much more!

RCCs focus on meeting people where they are and helping individuals increase their recovery capital, build hope, and sustain their long-term recovery goals.

RCCs provided over 13,000 hours of service to over 24,000 individuals in 2023!

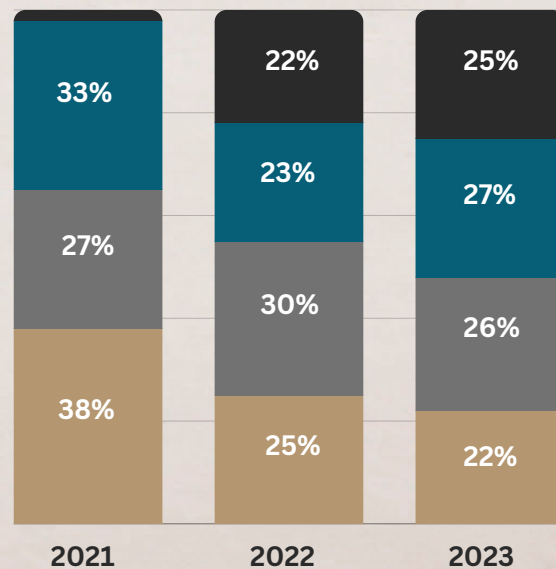
