


Recovery Community Centers

2023 Missouri Summary

Recovery Community Centers (RCCs) are community-based, peer-run organizations that offer resources and compassionate support for individuals with substance use disorders and their families, no matter what phase of use or recovery they may be in. RCCs are not treatment centers but they can connect people to treatment or other community resources, depending on their needs.



Highlights from services provided by RCCs in 2023:

9,809 3.835 attendees at RCCsponsored events onsite connections with new participants attendees at RCC-sponsored 4,433 11,675 events in the community support telephone 6,039 activities held for people calls provided with SUD 3,361 people connected to assistance through street outreach 1,224 individuals engaged with employment services 623 individuals gained employment Participant's Primary Drug of Use 430 employers engaged with RCCs Opioids Only Stimulants Only Opioids and Stimulants 2% Other 22% 25% 33% 14,196 23% 27% of life-saving naloxone kits 27% distributed - almost twice 30% 26% as much as last year! 38% 25% 22%
